

Kate Osborne MP Monthly Newsletter October 2022 Dear constituent.

This month has been hugely chaotic. We have had a revolving door of Prime Ministers and Cabinet Members. Now we have another Tory Prime Minister imposed on us all, Rishi Sunak, trounced by Truss in the Tory leadership elections, installed by a handful of Tory MPs.

In her brief 44 days as Prime Minister I had a PMQ and asked Truss about the failures of privatisation. It does not work. It doesn't work for our NHS or for our postal service – with Royal Mail taking £758 million in profit last year - yet Universal Service obligation is at risk, workers' pay, conditions & 10k jobs under threat. You can watch the full clip of my PMQ here. Of course she had no answers and the very next morning she resigned.

And now we have Sunak. The wealthy former banker will undoubtedly try to gloss over his record in Government, but we know as Chancellor, he was the man at the helm when Tory chaos and incompetence caused the cost-of-living crisis. # SUNAK HAS BEEN IMPOSED - WE NEED A GENERAL ELECTION NOW

Rishi Sunak has been imposed on the country by a handful of Tory MPs.

Sunak has not said a word about his plans as PM, but we know as Chancellor, he was in charge of the economy as Tory chaos caused the cost-of-living crisis.

He may be the UK's new Prime Minister, but he will be a continuation of Tory chaos and callous disregard of our communities.

My Jarrow constituents do not want another unelected Tory Prime Minister, they want a Government that will give them hope - that will fix the damage that the Conservative party has caused

We know Rishi Sunak is planning for more cuts to our public services - and will continue to put big business and the wealthy ahead of our communities.

Sunak has no mandate - the public need a say, we need a general election now.

Prime Minister Rishi Sunak - a PM who is twice as rich as the king - is promising to clear up the mess they have caused. Of course he won't make any changes to their ideological direction, he will continue to make decisions that benefit the wealthy, cutting taxes for the rich & attacking the most vulnerable.

Working class people will be left to foot the bill for his "tough-decisions" with Sunak and his Chancellor Hunt planning on making billions of cuts to public services.

It is clearer than ever before that we need a general election. It doesn't matter which Tory is at the top – they are not on the side of working people.

Wherever I go in the constituency we see the devastating impact of the last twelve years of Conservative Governments have had on our community.

1 in 3 kids in our constituency are currently living in food poverty, we have a housing crisis, a cost-of-living crisis and people like 73 year old Kathleen who got in touch with me to say she has already cut back on food and heating and doesn't know what else to do.

I've spent the last month in Parliament and around the constituency highlighting these issues and supporting people as much as I can - but we won't deliver change for the people of Jarrow without a General election.

I have launched a **fighting fund** to ensure we are General Election ready. Now, more than ever, it is vital that we prepare. #### Justice Questions:

This month in the Chamber, I questioned the Government on their appallingly low charge and conviction rate on rape cases – as well as the misogyny, racism and homophobia highlighted in the Casey report. You can watch the clip of my question in full\_here.

Unsurprisingly I got no answer as the Tories continue to pass the buck. Following on from this question, I have spoken with, and written to, Northumbria Police and Crime Commissioner Kim McGuinness to ask her to look into Northumbria Police's culture around misogyny, racism and homophobia.

## Business, Energy, and Industrial Strategy questions:

During BEIS questions, I again raised the Horizon Scandal. It is disgraceful that this Government is still handing multi-million-pound contracts to Fujitsu. The Government must urgently pause all existing contracts with Fujitsu and undertake a full review of all contracts with this appalling company. You can watch a clip of my question here. ## CWU & Royal Mail dispute:

Following on from my PMQ, during which I raised the CWU dispute with Royal Mail and the gross mismanagement that is happening. This month, I also wrote to the CEO of Royal Mail to urge him to immediately meet with CWU to engage in meaningful discussions regarding both potential job losses and the on going disputes. As someone who worked for Royal Mail for 25 years I find it deeply disturbing that the senior leadership of Royal Mail are playing politics with peoples livelihoods. #### Labour Outlook:

If we don't continue to fight for the NHS, it won't survive until the next General Election. We all know the Tory ideology – run down our public services, starve them of resources to make them cheaper to privatise and give to their mates to make money from. Nowhere is that more evident than our NHS where decades of privatisation by stealth has led to billions going into the pockets of privateers at the expense of patients – profit being put over public health and our communities.
